
It is with great pleasure that our family makes a contribution to the Charles M. Vogler Archive Memorial.

# Reunion Plans Continue: Mark Your Calendars July 25, 1998 in Winston Salem, NC

Voglers to Gather in July of 1998 at Hawthorne Inn and Conference Center in Winston-Salem, NC

The date for the fourth Vogler Family Reunion will be July 25, 1998 and the location will be the Hawthorne Inn and Conference Center near Old Salem in Winston-Salem, NC. We are again meeting in the town which was one of the cornerstones of our American family. The Hawthorne Inn is also the site that the preliminary steering committee of the PCVF met in 1986.

Activities are scheduled to begin at 9:30 am in the Sycamore Ballroom with family registration until 3:00 pm. The ballroom will host several of the weekend activities: our "Mini-Mall" will have Arts & Crafts, & Vogler collectibles for sale. The artists have agreed to donate 15 % of sales back to the PCVF. Vogler T-shirts will also be on sale in the ballroom with 100 % of the sales donated to the PCVF by Ben and Madelyn Fogler. This is one of our few sources of revenue so please help. Our Swiss travelers will be on hand in the ballroom to share film and stories about their adventure. The banquet that evening will take place in the Sycamore (Please see menu listed below). For those who would like to participate, we will have an Old Salem costume contest during the day. Individual ballots will be collected throughout the day and the winner will be announced at the banquet that night. The winner will take home a 1996 drawing of our "Home" Swiss Oberhahli Church and surrounding area by a Swiss artist.

We need volunteers to help during the day of the reunion for an hour or so and we would like to involve as many people as possible. If you are interested please contact Betty Houston at 704-366-7440.

We are asking reunion participants to please stay at the Hawthorne Inn for your overnight lodging, as we must rent out at least 50 rooms in order to get the ballroom at no charge. Rooms rent for \$65.00 each single or double, only for those people identifying yourself as with the PCVF. These rates and rooms will be blocked with reservations made before July 4, 1998. If you would like to come in early and stay Friday night, the same rate will apply if you reserve under the PCVF name.

The evening banquet will begin with dinner at 6:00 PM and consist of:
