Although still a year away, planning for our Swiss Trip III is now already well underway. With the remarkably successful and enjoyable experiences of the 1992 and the 1997 trip behind us, we are now in the process of setting up the itinerary arrangements for our third "Return of the Swiss Family Vogler," to be based largely on what proved to be the most popular and memorable parts of both earlier tours.

As of now, the following places have been tentatively selected to be included in the trip schedule, either as overnight stays or as significant stops along the way, using the most scenic highway / Alpine mountain pass routes available to us:

Zurich (air arrival / departure, city tour)

Niederhasli / Oberhasli (pilgrimage to Vogler / Fogler ancestral village)

Schaffhausen (visit to Falls of the Rhine River, Europe's biggest)

Berne (Swiss capital, Old City famous Bear Pit, etc.)

Chillon Castle (historic Lake Geneva island fortress near Montreux)

Geneva (Old City, UN European Headquarters, etc.)

Yvoire, France (picturesque medieval walled town on Lake Geneva)

Zermatt (high Alpine mountain resort just north of Matterhorn

Lugano / Locarno (lakeside resorts in Italian-speaking Ticino canton)

Lake Maggiore, Switzerland / Italy (group boat ride, ferry crossing)

Lucerne (lakeside resort, spectacular Alpine scenery in "William Tell" country)


Interlaken / Grindelwald (Alpine area of nearby Jungfrau, etc.)

Brienz (lakeside resort with national woodworking school / museum)

Vaduz, Liechtenstein (visit to capital and area of nearby Prince's Castle)

Lindau, Germany (famous small island resort in Lake Constance)





Although changes and substitutions may be made in this list before it becomes final, our hope is to provide a wide range of worthwhile, already tested sightseeing that can reasonably be fitted into a 10 day stay in Switzerland, keeping daily bus-riding time to a minimum and also reducing as far as possible long stretches of unavoidable walking for those who would not enjoy it.

Gem Hunt 1999- A Great Success For All Who Attended.

n July 30, 31, and August 1, 1999 members of the Vogler family representing PCVF gathered at the NC Mineral museum located in Spruce Pine, NC to begin a fun filled

weekend. After everyone met, enjoyed a tour of the museum and became "instant" experts in identifying gem stones, we were off to try our luck. First stop was one of the more popular mines, "Gem Mountain", where almost everyone purchased a "Bucket", found a reasonably comfortable spot on the wood bench in front of the "sluice", or running water trough, then loaded the screened frame with a shovel full of gem ladened dirt and began the search! It didn't take long to uncover several gleaming stones that surfaced after a hefty swishing in the running water. Depending on the type "gem bucket" purchased, lucky miners could find rough rubies, emeralds, sapphires, garnets, amethysts, aquamarines, and a multitude of actual gem stones worth considerably more than the cost of each bucket of dirt. During the search, as gem stones are discovered they are carefully stored in a plastic bag. When finished, the stones can be checked and graded by experts on site. If one wishes, the more valuable stones found can be faceted, or cut, to produce beautiful gems ready for mounting. Those who prefer can browse the gem shop for ready made jewelry. There are a number of mines in the area, all of which offer an equal opportunity to "strike it rich". Some members of the group tried several different mines, but we don't know of anyone who came away a millionaire... After a busy afternoon of gem hunting, several members of the group decided it would be great fun to attend the large gemstone festival show being held at the downtown Spruce Pine Pinebridge Executive Center. This excursion offered access to dozens of gemstone dealers under one roof, and a chance to enjoy welcomed air conditioning!

Browsing through the maze of booths and talking with vendors took up the rest of the afternoon. A few small gemstone purchases and some time later found the group looking for dinner rather than more gemstones. Everyone met at a local "Western Steer" type restaurant for dinner. Afterwards, several gathered at the hotel for conversation, bragging, story telling, reliving the days activities and planning for the following day. On Saturday, the day was almost a carbon copy of the previous afternoon, except the emphasis was more on gem stone hunting. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the day of fun and rock hunting. Again, no millionaires, but a lot of Vogler's who really enjoyed an outing with brothers, sisters, kids, grandkids, etc.. Later that evening the group converged on a recommended local restaurant, already, overcrowded with Saturday night diners. After an extended "wait" in the August heat, we were seated around a large table and enjoyed a super meal served by a most pleasant wait staff who were into "over-time" taking care of our party.

Later that evening, a group gathered at the hotel to enjoy each others company and recap the days events. The next day, Sunday, would be departure day, so those who planned to get an early start said their "good-byes", while some of those hooked on gem stone hunting made plans to meet back at the mine right after breakfast for one last search for "the big one".

In summary, for our first "official" PCVF gem stone weekend outing, it would have to be declared a huge success! All who attended, of which there was an unofficial count totaling 28, made it clear they would be first to sign up for the next one..Perhaps the most enjoyable part of the weekend was an opportunity for family to spend fun time together as a group.
