
Updated Itinerary For Swiss Trip III

Day 1 (Friday 8-10) Charlotte-?-Zurich: Assemble in Charlotte, Airline and departure time yet to be determined as we are still reviewing flight schedules and Airlines. Information will be given to signed up travelers. Day 2 (Sat. 8-11) Zurich: Check into hotel, rest, then meet in lobby to go as a group into downtown Zurich for lunch, with afternoon free for informal sightseeing or shopping. Dinner at hotel.

Day 3 (Sun. 8-12) Zurich-Niederhasli-Oberhasli-

Zurich: Family pilgrimage visit to Niederhasli (Church service and pre-paid lunch at Frieden Restaurant) and nearby ancestral village of Oberhasli. Drive north to Falls of the Rhine near Schaffhausen and German border. Return to Zurich for dinner and night at same Rigihof Hotel.

Day 4 (Mon. 8-13) Zurich-Bern - Lucerne: Drive from Zurich southwest to Bern, stopping for sightseeing (Rose Garden, Bear Pit, arcaded main street, Parliament, etc.)



and lunch. Proceed northeast to Lucerne, with local sightseeing (medieval covered bridge, Lion Monument, etc.) then check into hotel for dinner and night there.

Day 5 (Tues, 8-14) Lucerne-Furka Pass-Zermatt (Alex Schlosshotel): After breakfast, leave Lucerne and proceed along western and southern shores of Lake Lucerne to Swiss national hero William Tell's home town of Altdorf, then take gently climbing major highway south to Andermatt, then turn west to enter scenic Furka Pass. Stop for box lunch picnic together at top of the pass, then continue on to the Rhone Glacier ice cave for visit and "photo op." Then follow Rhone River valley southwest to Brig and Visp, then highway south to.. See Itinerary Update page 2.

its end at Tasch, leaving bus and taking rail shuttle to nearby Zermatt just to the south. Leaving town railway station,, proceed as a group for walk to nearby hotel for dinner and night there.

Day 6 (Wed. 8-15)-Zermatt-Gornergrat-Zermatt (Alex Schlosshotel): After breakfast, walk together to nearby base cog railway station and board train for ride up to summit station at Gornergrat elev. 10,300 ft. with spectacular views of the nearby Matterhorn and other major Alpine peaks) for sightseeing and lunch. Then reboard train for return back down to Zermatt. Rest of afternoon free-dinner and night at same hotel.

Day 7 (Thurs. 8-16)-Zermatt-Furka/St. Gotthard Passes-Lugano (International au Lac Hotel): After breakfast in Zermatt, take shuttle to Tasch. Reboard bus and drive back to Visp, box lunch provided, then proceed to high Alpine Furka Pass and on to St. Gotthard Pass, then turning south to descend into Italian-speaking canton of Ticino, proceeding to west shore of Lake Lugano, with dinner and night at hotel in resort city of Lugano.

Day 8 (Fri. 8-17)-Lugano-Locarno-Stresa(Italy)-Lugano: Drive west to Locarno on Lake Maggiore, then tun south to cross into Italy and proceed down west side of lake to lakeshore resort town of Stresa. Leave bus to take motor launch for boat ride to nearby Borromeo Islands for island restaurant lunch followed by boat tour, then return to bus for ferry ride across lake at its mid-point. Proceed east to southern tip of Lake Como, then return to Switzerland and Lake Lugano area for dinner and night at same Lugano hotel.

Day 9 (Sat. 8-18)-Lugano-St. Moritz-Innsbruck (Austria): After breakfast, drive northeast into Italy across to northern end of Lake Como, then proceed north and east through Italian Alps, re-entering Switzerland and continuing on to famous old Swiss resort of St. Moritz, stopping there briefly for sightseeing. Then continue on to extreme eastern tip of Switzerland and cross into Austria for drive northeast through Austrian Alps to equally famous and even more scenic Austrian resort of Innsbruck for lunch, then afternoon sightseeing, with dinner and night at hotel there.

Day 10 (Sun. 8-19)-Innsbruck-Neuschwanstein Castle(Germany) Liechtenstein-Zurich: After breakfast, leave Innsbruck and drive west, then northwest to cross into Germany (Bavaria) near Fussen, stopping to visit Neuschwanstein Castle (probably the best-known Alpine castle of all {thanks in part to Disneyland}, even though not actually built until the mid 19th Century by mad King Ludwig II of Bavaria). Then after lunch re-enter Austria for drive west to Principality of Liechtenstein, stopping briefly for sightseeing in its small capital city of Vaduz below the Prince's Castle. Then drive west across the Rhine River to re-enter Switzerland, continuing west to Zurich for dinner and night at hotel.

Day 11 (Mon. 8-20)-Zurich-?-Charlotte: After breakfast at hotel, proceed to Zurich/Kloten Airport for return day flight to Charlotte.

Day 12 (Tues. 8-21) Home: Chance to sit back, relax and recall memories from a voyage that will last a lifetime.

Werner Kaag Confirms Information Concerning Philipp Christoph Vogler

Fred Vogler Informs Us Of The Contributions From A New Found Friend Of The Family

Fred's Letter Of Introduction Reveals Fascinating New Proof And Documentation Of Our Swiss Roots The Board Thanks Werner, Fred, And Edward Cooper For Their Continued Work On Our Behalf

WELCOME FROM PCVF, INC. TO OUR NEW GERMAN FRIEND, WERNER KAAG

It is with great pleasure that we take this opportunity to introduce to our members and other readers a man who, in the six months we have known him, has already proved to be a devoted friend and benefactor for us. Earlier this year, Werner Kaag took it upon himself to undertake research into the family background of our ancestress Anna Catharina Seitz, Philipp Christoph Vogler's first wife and mother of all his children from whom we are descended. The amazing result of his efforts on our behalf has been to trace her Seitz family line back SEVEN generations beginning with hers, after Werner had gone in person to two earlier Seitz family home towns in the state of Wuerttemberg, Germany, to locate the needed records, beginning with her birthplace of Oetisheim, then moving back first to Lorch, then to Goeppingen where her ancestors first lived.

Although the first church-register birth record to be found was for Johannes Seitz, b. 29 June 1562 in Goeppingen, Germany (170 years before Anna Catharina's birth in 1732), that same entry shows the name of his father, Jacob Seitz, whom we can now honor as her great-great-great-great-grandfather and someone from whom our own Vogler line also descends through her. It should be noted that up to now we have only been able to trace Philipp Christoph's family back five generations including his own, his great-great-grandfather having been Jacob ("Jogli") Vogler, presumed to have been born before 1599, date of the start of the Niederhasli church register.

In addition to preparing for us a handsome bound booklet of over 40 pages of photocopied original church records and maps of the areas concerned, he has also sent us two large Seitz and Vogler European family tree charts in color (each approx. 21" x 17") as well as large color reproductions of historical maps showing the location of all the towns our ancestors are known to have lived in before emigrating to North America in 1742. We hope to have all these showpieces on display at our next reunion.

As for Werner Kaag himself, he was born on 30 June 1947 in Pforzheim / Baden, Germany, just to the southeast of Karlsruhe and not far from Philipp Christoph's birthplace of Gondelsheim and Anna Catharina's of Oetisheim, both just to the northeast of Karlsruhe. After secondary school, he undertook university studies in Freiburg / Baden, specializing in history, political science, and geography before undertaking a teaching career at the high school level, currently in Muehlacker, a town which happens to lie just south of Oetisheim itself. While still students in Freiburg, in 1970 Werner and his wife came to the United States on a two-month trip, traveling by Greyhound bus all over the country while visiting American relatives along the way. After their return to Germany, they proceeded to start a family of their own, with two sons born in 1976 and 1982. He and his family now live in Remchingen, located between Pforzheim and Karlsruhe in Baden / Wuerttemberg.

Werner's genealogical interest became active while he was in his late 40s upon acquiring a small but efficient family-tree computer program and undertaking family history research from that point. Two years ago, he began to read the same Internet "Queries" pages used by American family history buffs, leading him to decide to offer his services to some of them in helping locate European ancestors or simply to provide advice as to how they should proceed with their research. However, he has chosen to limit his inquiries on their behalf to his own area of Southwestern Germany and occasionally Switzerland, which is how we have been fortunate to come to know him ourselves through the helpful intermediation of our cousin Edward Cooper of San Antonio, TX, himself a descendant of Philipp Christoph's son George Michael Vogler.

As it happened, Edward Cooper had arranged with Werner to do on-site Vogler research in Gondelsheim and had already received much carefully prepared photocopied documentary information from him before making direct contact with PCVF early this year. Some of those photocopies have turned out to provide clear proof we did not have earlier of Philipp Christoph's actual birth date and of the old spelling (Gundelsheim) of his birthplace, now Gondelsheim.



Upon establishing contact with us and now realizing that the primary benefit of Werner's efforts had been to confirm in even clearer form what our Swiss friend and benefactor Augustin Maissen had already turned up for us there in Gondelsheim in 1980, he not only promptly sent us copies of the substantial documentation he had received but also took the initiative of putting us in touch with Werner, who promptly volunteered to undertake research for us concerning Anna Catharina Seitz's line, something that we had not been able to pursue beyond her parent's generation since her birthplace was finally identified for us in 1992 through the efforts of our cousin Frances Myers of Raleigh.

How very glad we are to have him enter our lives at this time! And we look forward to coming to know him even better in the time ahead.
