Vogler Family Nova Scotia Trip Itinerary: Rescheduled For Summer 2006

DAY 1 – 7/14/2006: PORTLAND, Maine: Group meets at Holiday Inn by the Bay, located in downtown Portland. The hotel provides a free van shuttle service to/from Portland International Jetport, Portland Train Station (Amtrak/Downeaster) and bus station. The hotel features an indoor pool, sauna, full service restaurant and lounge. For those driving in, free parking is provided for overnight guests. Afternoon is free for casual sightseeing in Portland's nearby art and waterfront districts, which are within walking distance of the hotel. Dinner included at the Holiday Inn by the Bay dining room (choice of menu with a variety of dinner entrees from which to choose). No motor coach service provided today. Luggage service to your room is included.

DAY 2-7/15/2006: Portland - Bangor - St. John NB Canada: After an included buffet breakfast at the hotel (coupons provided), you'll meet your motor coach and driver who will stay with you until you return to Portland. Your luggage service from guest room to motor coach is included. Board the motor coach for a brief follow-up sightseeing tour of Portland before proceeding northeast along I-95 to Augusta (state capital), then on to Bangor. Lunch on own in Old Town, Maine before continuing to Orono, Maine (home of the University of Maine and Fogler Library, named in honor of our distinguished late cousin Raymond Fogler, who attended both our first and second reunions in 1987 and 1990). After brief stop there, the motor coach will return to Bangor and continues east to Calais, Maine. Pass through customs and immigration the border crossing into New Brunswick, Canada (ID information is required in advance). Set your watch ahead one hour as you cross the St. Croix River and proceed to New Brunswick's capital city of St. John. Check in to your hotel for the evening at approximately 6:00 pm with dinner included.

DAY 3 – 7/16/2006 :ST. JOHN, N.B. / NEW GLASGOW, N.S.: After breakfast at hotel, board the motor coach and make a quick stop at Reversing Falls Rapids before traveling through Fundy National Park to Hopewell Rocks, site of some of the highest tides in the world. Continue to the city of Moncton, where you'll have lunch on your own. Proceed southeast into Nova Scotia at Amherst. Travel to New Glasgow where you will spend the night. A lobster choice dinner is included (meat alternative also available).

DAY 4 – 7/17/2006: NEW GLASGOW / LOUISBOURG: After breakfast at hotel, board bus and cross the Canso Causeway to Cape Breton Island (the northern portion of Nova Scotia), known as the Scotland of North America. Continue to Sydney where you'll have lunch on your own. This afternoon, step back in time with a visit to The Fortress of Louisbourg where you'll enjoy a guided tour and time to explore on your own. This restored 18th-century French fortress of Louisbourg is often called "the Williamsburg of the North" and was the scene of Philipp Christoph Vogler's 1746 marriage to Anna Catharina Seitz after its capture by New England volunteer soldiers supporting the British naval attack. As no hotels to accommodate a group near the fort, overnight tonight in the Sydney area with dinner included.

DAY 5-7/18/2006 :LOUISBOURG / HALIFAX / LUNENBURG: After breakfast at hotel, board bus to drive west across Cape Breton Island, crossing onto Nova Scotia mainland at Port Hastings. Continue southwest to the provincial capital of Halifax, where you'll have lunch on your own. This afternoon, visit the Vogler's Cove and other Vogler sites on your way to the UNESCO World Heritage town of Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. Dinner and overnight in the Lunenburg / Bridgewater area.

DAY 6-7/19/2006 :LUNENBURG / BAR HARBOR, ME.: Make a brief stop at Vogler Family sites in Lunenberg before traveling to Yarmouth, NS. Board the 1:00 pm CAT ferry to Bar Harbor, ME. The crossing takes about 3 hours and your motor coach travels with you. You'll set your watch back 1 hour when you arrive in Bar Harbor at approximately 3:00 pm EST. Free time in Bar Harbor this afternoon. Check in to your hotel for one night. A lobster choice dinner is included tonight. Say good-bye to our motor coach driver this evening at 8:00 pm.

DAY 7 – 7/20/2006: BAR HARBOR / WALDOBORO / PORTLAND: After a deluxe continental breakfast at hotel, board bus to proceed west through charming mid-coast Maine villages of Camden and Rockland to Waldoboro, Maine. Waldoboro was originally named Broad Bay and our Vogler ancestors' first American home from 1742 until their departure for North Carolina in 1770. Lunch on own in the Waldoboro area, followed by local sightseeing (including greetings from representatives of local Old Broad Bay Historical Society, long in contact with our own Foundation). Bus then continues west along coast to So. Bristol and nearby Christmas Cove (discovered by Jamestown's Capt. John Smith on Christmas Day 1612), then proceeds directly to Portland for our final night together, back at the Holiday Inn by the Bay. Dinner tonight in a restored mansion in downtown Portland, now operating as a restaurant called The Roma Café.

DAY 8 – 7/21/2006: PORTLAND / HOME: Breakfast included at your leisure in the hotel dining room before heading homeward. The hotel shuttle is available upon request.



If you don't remember any of this, I will refresh your memory; this is information that can only be found

after hours of endless, painstaking research which I did for your convenience.

Philip Christoph was a member of the PCVF Hockey Team back in the mid-1700s. That team struggled, and struggled often. But with time, they got better and went on to win the championship in 1765. And, yeah, you guessed it - Philip Christoph was the MVP. "I don't think it can get better than this," he said, in German nonetheless, after the game. Wrong.

He would later have an organization named after him and ancestry traced back through him. And not many people can say that about themselves. But that's beside the point.

He played the game because he loved it. And he wasn't too bad at it either, which made it that much more special for him. But he didn't obtain that skill for the game just by picking up a stick and hitting the ice; it took practice.

As a career 100-goal scorer, Philip Christoph was an elite athlete of his time, especially in the game of hockey, so much so that he is in the Hockey Hall of Fame.

What you just read is actually completely untruthful. Philip Christoph never played hockey, he never won a championship. There was no research, except from the top of my head. But this can serve as an important lesson to us all.


with ownership. He was just an all around good player.

Philip Christoph would have never been so great at hockey, had it been popular or even existed in the United States at his time, without practice. Sure, natural talent exists. But to be among the elite, among the Wayne Gretzky's, the Mario Lemieux's, you must practice.

And if you don't succeed the first time, do what the popular adage says and "try, try again." You're having trouble scoring in hockey? Go ask your coach for help and keep practicing. You're having trouble with math? Go ask your teacher for help and keep practicing. Hard work will pay off, as it did in this fictional story of Philip Christoph. Perseverance is very important, especially when learning something new. You can't give in easily just because you're not good at it. Who knows? One day you might be as good as Philip Christoph supposedly was in hockey.

What better way to round out this piece than with an inspirational quote that ties

Profiles of Board Members and Influential Figures in the PCVF

Jerry has been a member of the PCVF, Inc. since 1987 and a Board member since 1992. He is also known as the PCVF family artist, drawing several historical structures prominent in our family's history. These prints can be seen and purchased on the web site. Jerry was interim Secretary in 1997 and Secretary from 1998-2002, he then held the office of Vice President from 2002-2004, assuming the office of President in 2004 until his term expires in 2006. Jerry attended the first family reunion in 1987, and the last three reunions; 1994,1998, and 2003. Jerry also accompanied the family on all three Swiss trips I, II, III.

Jerry graduated from Forsyth Technical College with a A.A.S. Architecture. He serves as a Salesman and Project Manager for Glass Systems Inc. in Lithonia, Ga. J. B. Houston, IV; Vice President: 209 Annaberg Lane, Monroe, NC 28110.

J.B. has been a board member since 1986 and Lifetime member of PCVF. Inc. He served as videographer for both the first and second Steering Committee meetings in 1986; gemstone committee chairman, heading the Gemstone Hunt in Little Switzerland, NC in 1999. Board positions that J.B. has held include, Treasurer from 1990-2000, Assistant Treasurer 2000-2004, and is currently serving as vice president of the PCVF, Inc. J.B. has supported the Foundation by attending the family reunions of 1987 (first reunion) and the July reunions of 1994,1998,2003. He is also an experienced traveler; as he accompanied the family on both Swiss Trip II (July '97) and Swiss Trip III (August 2001).

J.B. graduated from UNC-C with a degree in Political Science and a Masters in Public Administration, and is currently the Quality Control Manager with Carolina Marking Devices in Charlotte, NC.

Dr. Augustin Maissen (1921-1992)

Dr. Maissen was a Professor of Romance Languages at UNC and a colleague and friend of our Dr. Frederick W. Vogler. It was through this friendship and Dr. Maissen's travels that we came to know the definitive truth about our Swiss roots. In a trip to Europe in 1979, Dr. Maissen learned that there were two towns of similar name and that we had been focused on the wrong town as Philipp's hometown. Dr. Maissen, on his own time, sent inquiries to both towns asking for help in finding our printed family history. In January of 1980, Dr. Maissen received information from Pastor Mueller in Gondelsheim about Philipp and his father Hans Georg, as well as their immediate family for three generations. This was a tremendous find, and pivotal in ascertaining the true history of Vogler life in Europe. Sadly, Dr. Augustin Maissen passed away at the age of seventy one in May of 1992.
