Herbert Alexander Vogler, Jr.

Herbert grew up in a house in Old Salem, built by Elias Vogler. He graduated from UNC-Chapel Hill with a degree in Business Administration. He and Frances married in 1953 and moved to Roslyn Rd, Winston-Salem. He is a retired insurance adjuster, having worked for Gay and Tayler and starting his own company Vogler Adjusters, in

1965. He is a past president of the N.C. Adjusters Association and was one of its first members. He is a life long member of Home Moravian Church, where he played trombone in the band for 50 years. He and Frances have 3 children" Bert Vogler, who lives in Huntington Beach with wife Nance and their two children, Alex and Nikolai; Ellen Rogers, who lives on the Vogler farm with husband Buck and their two children, William and Christina; and Christina Riddle and husband Danny who live in Davie County.

Herb and Frances are Board Members of the PCV Foundation. They attended the reunion in Rockport Maine to see where the European Voglers landed in the United States, and went to Europe on the first tour of the PCV to see from whence they came.

Known Deaths In The Family




