THE PHILIP CHRISTOPH VOGLER MEMORIAL, INC. WAS FOUNDED BY CHARLES M. VOGLER, WITH THE FIRST STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING (SCM) BEING HELD ON JULY 27, 1986 AT WINSTON-SALEM, NC. IT WAS INCORPORATED ON AUGUST 1986, BY E. EDWARD VOGLER, JR. THE SECOND SCM WAS HELD ON OCTOBER 5, 1986. THE FIRST VOGLER REUNION WAS HELD ON APRIL 10-12, 1987 IN WINSTON-SALEM. THE NAME WAS CHANGED TO PHILIP CHRISTOPH VOGLER FOUNDATION, INC. IN JUNE 1994.

Easter signals the promise of spring with its colorful flowers, green grass and a sweetness in the air that only that season can bring. Most importantly, however, Easter is a celebration of the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ from His death on the cross. Because He suffered, died and rose again from the dead, we too can have eternal life if we put our trust in Him. No other religion on earth has a sinless Savior who died for our sins. None, period. That is the essence of what sets Christianity apart from all others. Therefore, it is important that we as Christians should always celebrate and proclaim Christ's resurrection, but especially so at Easter.

Since the beginning of our Philip Christoph Vogler Foundation in 1986, it has become a tradition for our members to attend the Easter Sunrise Service as a group creating a time of fellowship with family and friends in the same historic home place where our ancestors lived. It is also a time of joy, excitement, anticipation, reflection, praise and worship—sometimes all at once.

The Easter Liturgy at Home Moravian Church begins at 6:30 am, after which, we begin a solemn, slow and steady pace to assemble in God's Acre, the Old Salem cemetery. Along the way, six Brass Bands from the twelve churches of the Moravian Church Salem Congregation of Winston-Salem play the Liturgy's hymns antiphonally.

Once everyone is in the cemetery, each of the six epiphany bands join with the other six bands that are already assembled in the open area of the cemetery, creating one large band of approximately 400 members. The band then plays Beethoven's "Creation Hymn" which accompanies the second part of the Liturgy. The service itself is timed in such a way that the sun rises at the conclusion of this impressive Easter Service.

The first recorded observance of Easter in God's Acre was in 1732 when several young men met there to sing hymns and meditate on Christ's death and Resurrection. This proved to be a moving experience which resulted in a deeper appreciation of the Resurrection.

This year will mark the 275th year of the Easter celebration at Home Moravian Church in Old Salem. Come join us as we continue the tradition of celebrating Easter in this historic place.

SWITZERLAND: PHILIPP CHRISTOPH VOGLER'S SWISS ANCESTORS

PART I

About six miles due north of downtown Zurich's main railway station and less than two miles west of busy Zurich / Kloten Airport, three quiet Swiss villages stand in a row along a local road winding through the gentle landscape of that part of non-Alpine northern Switzerland. There is nothing about this rural setting to suggest that the country's largest city and biggest airport lie just beyond the horizon.

Actually these three communities make up one single town as they have since the Middle Ages: first, Oberhasli ("Upper Hasli"), then half a mile further along, Mettmenhasli ("Middle Hasli"), and finally after another half-mile, Niederhasli ("Lower Hasli"), largest and most important of the three with its partly medieval Swiss Reformed parish church, town government offices, and a number of small businesses. Currently about 3,600 people live in Niederhasli, with some 1,500 in Oberhasli and about 500 others in Mettmenhasli. Although Oberhasli has its own small old Swiss Reformed church, it is part of the Niederhasli parish and now has only occasional services performed there by that church's pastor. Despite their names, there is actually very little difference in elevation between the villages – Oberhasli being only forty feet higher than Niederhasli a little over a mile away, a rise not apparent to a casual observer. Most of the houses in all three villages are traditional solid brick structures covered with painted stucco, although a few modern apartment buildings can be found standing unobtrusively on the outskirts.

Although pleasant and well maintained, none of the three Haslis seems interesting or important enough to warrant a detour from the main north-south highway between Zurich and the nearby German border at the Rhine River. But for that sizable group of Philipp Christoph Vogler's American and Canadian descendents living today, this is indeed the *Heimat* – the indisputable ancestral home, the starting point for what was to be three centuries of migration that would lead the paternal line of this family first into Germany, then across the Atlantic to North America, there to flourish and spread steadily across the continent with the appearance of each new generation. Those modern Vogler descendents now enjoy the rare good fortune not only to be able to trace their New World roots but also to have had their Old World roots discovered and clearly identified for them as far back as nearly five hundred years, back to the Middle Ages and a time long before economic necessity finally inspired German-born Philipp Christoph's Swiss grandfather Rudolf to leave home to seek his fortune elsewhere. As it happened, that first home was Oberhasli.

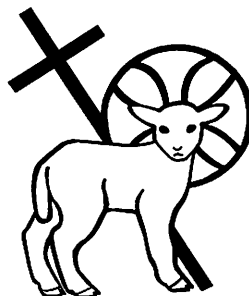

Profiles of Board Members and Influential Figures in the PCVF

**Dr. Frederick
W. Vogler**

Frederick's parents were Curtis Linville Vogler, originally from Winston-Salem, NC, and Marion Wright Vogler of Burlington, VT, where he was born and raised. Like his father before him, Fred attended the

University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, receiving his B.A. and M.A. degrees in French and in 1961 his Ph.D. degree in Romance Languages. He taught one year at the University of Iowa, then returned to teach at UNC-CH from 1963-2005, and where presently he is Prof. Emeritus.

Dr. Vogler is a descendant of Samuel Vogler, fourth child of Philipp Christoph Vogler. Frederick was part of the PCVM 1st and 2nd steering committees and a member of the PCVF BOD since its inception, 1986. He served as Documentation Committee Chairman (1986-87), and was elected PCVM's Vice-President (1992-94) and President (1994-96) and presently Pres. Emeritus. While serving as Historian, Frederick was and still is instrumental in researching our European roots prior to 1742. Dr. Vogler wrote two chapters of our family history book, *Descendants of Philipp Christoph Vogler*, chapter I, XX. His loyal service on the Trip Committee as Tour Guide (for all three trips) and helping to plan the itinerary, proved invaluable to each and every trip! As for the Reunions, he was not only there, he was also a speaker.

Frederick is the proud father of son, Robert F. Vogler and the every beaming grandfather to his lovely granddaughter, Katherine "Kate" Vogler.

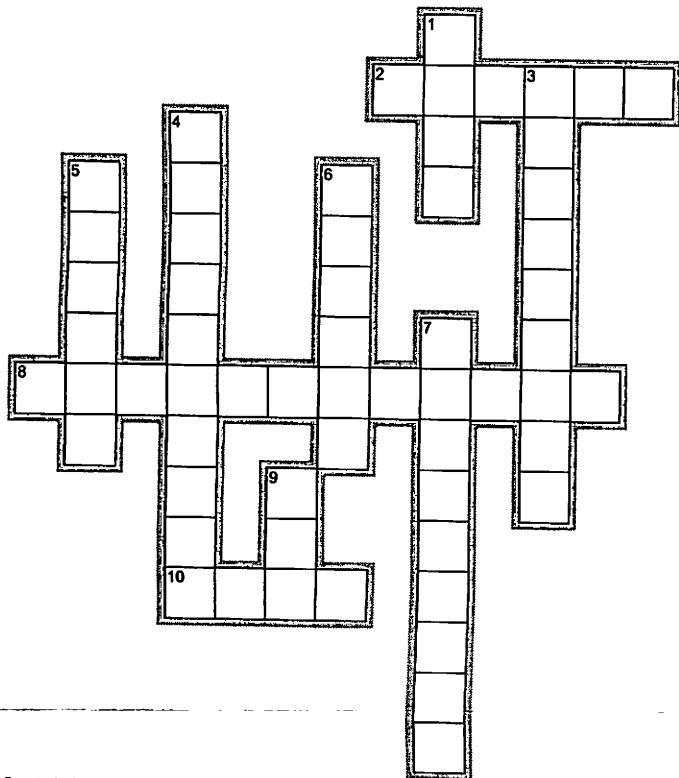

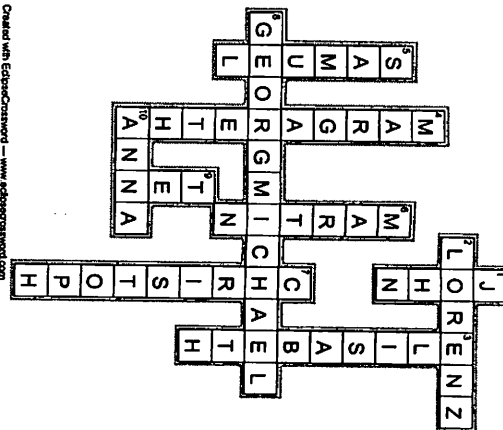
