THE NAME WAS CHANGED TO PHILIP CHRISTOPH VOGLER FOUNDATION, INC. IN JUNE 1994.

SWITZERLAND: PHILIPP CHRISTOPH VOGLER'S SWISS ANCESTORS

Who were the first Oberhasli Voglers who can be identified as lineal ancestors of Philipp Christoph and his descendants? There is evidence that the Vogler name itself appears in local legal documents as early as 1455. However, systematic record-keeping for births and deaths was not established in Switzerland until late in the next century. As it happened, those Swiss cantons like Zurich that had gone over to the Protestant Reformation were the first to make such record-keeping a matter of public policy, since all parishes of the Swiss Reformed Church were also units of cantonal civil administration as well, an archival arrangement not generally used until much later in those cantons to the south which had remained predominately Roman Catholic.

In the register of births and deaths for the Reformed parish of Niederhasli (to which the villages of Oberhasli and Mettmenhasli also belonged), the earliest entries date from 1599, so that births and deaths occurring before that year are not recorded there. But when Philipp Christoph Vogler's line is traced back to that point, his paternal great-great-grandparents emerge for us there at the beginning of the Seventeenth Century: Jogli ("Jacob") Vogler and his wife Agly ("Agatha"), née Martaler, recorded as having been the parents of Philipp Christoph's great-grandfather Ulrich, born in Oberhasli in 1631. The register then shows that Ulrich Vogler, having married Anna Vogel, was the father of Rudolf Vogler, also born in Oberhasli in 1657 and later to be Philipp Christoph's grandfather after his own emigration from Switzerland to the town of Gondelsheim in what was then the German Palatinate, now a part of the modern state of Baden-Wuerttemberg in southwestern Germany. Up until about three years ago (2004), Rudolf had remained a particularly enigmatic figure in our Vogler family history, for nothing was yet known about his reasons for choosing to leave Switzerland to settle some hundred miles to the north. After the record of his 1657 birth in Oberhasli, no mention had yet been found of him for the next thirty-eight years until his own marriage record and the birth records of the children of that marriage began appearing over the next dozen years in Gondelsheim's Lutheran parish register. Then, to our pleased surprise, we were informed from Berlin by the German husband of a descendant of Philipp Christoph's aunt Anna Barbara that additional information had been discovered in the Niederhasli marriage and death registers, not previously reported to us. A series of entries in those registers showed that in 1681 Rudolf had been previously married in Oberhasli at the age of twenty-four to Barbara Bockhorn, with whom he had had a son and a daughter seven years apart, both of whom had died in early infancy. His wife Barbara's death in 1689 had been recorded not only in the Niederhasli death register but also in that of the parish church in Bretten, a German town just south of Gondelsheim, thereby showing that the couple was no longer living in Switzerland by then but rather in Germany. Why had they gone to live in that particular distant town? The most likely explanation appears to be that Barbara's uncle Felix Bockhorn had already been living there for many years, having married there in 1657 according to local records, a situation that could well have prompted Rudolf and Barbara to go live near him there in war-torn Germany in the hope of finding a better, more prosperous life there as "Swiss Palatine" guest workers like so many thousands of their countrymen at that tumultuous moment in German history.

Ironically, although the surname Vogler can be found in nearby communities in Canton Zurich, no one bearing that name is to be found today in Oberhasli itself. In the churchyard outside the small Reformed church in Oberhasli can be found the names of several Martalers and Vogels, but there is no longer a single grave marker bearing the Vogler name itself – even though the *Historical and Biographical Dictionary of Switzerland* speaks of that family as still "flourishing" there as late as 1934 when the volume containing its article on Swiss Vogler families was published.

Like the flowers in a once-popular American song, where indeed have all the Oberhasli Voglers gone?



Profiles of Board Members and Influential Figures in the PCVF

Charles McKinney Vogler

Founder& First President of the Philip Christoph Vogler Foundation Charles M. Vogler is a descendant of Christoph Vogler, eighth child of Philipp Christoph Vogler. Charles was born in Mount Airy, NC, the fifth child of John W. and Jessie McKinney Vogler, one of eleven total children. He grew up in Mount Airy

and graduated from Mount Airy High School. Charles began employment with Western Electric Company in Winston-Salem, NC. After a brief period there, he enlisted in the United States Air Force for a four-year tour of active duty as a Radar Technician.


Immediately following his Honorable Discharge, Charles entered North Carolina State University in Raleigh where he received a BS degree in Electrical Engineering. While in college, on December 26, 1955, he married Rachel Andrews from Winston-Salem. During the following 10 years, he became the proud father of three beautiful daughters, Debra Gail, Cynthia Charlene, and Rachel Susanne.

Charles began his professional electrical engineering career with Western Electric Company in Burlington, NC, where he designed & developed projects on the Hercules Missile System, Safeguard Missile System and other radar systems. He remained with the company for approximately 35 years, through several company name changes, and elected early retirement in 1990. Though he had started some genealogical research about 10 years before retiring, Charles began very intense study & research of genealogical history involving many hours and miles of travel to explore all avenues of information he could possibly locate. Several years of this full-time research, travel, talking with people, and writing culminated in the publishing of his book in 1994, DESCENDANTS OF PHILIP CHRISTOPH VOGLER.

Charles formed the Phillip Christoph Vogler Foundation, with much help, on July 27, 1986. He wanted to help educate the children on their heritage, and to teach them about their ancestors. Charles became the first Chairman and the editor of the newsletter until his death. He was instrumental in each of the reunions and enjoyed the Swiss Trips!

In Burlington, he and his family were very active members of Front Street United Methodist Church. and they enjoyed Easters together at Old Salem, in Winston-Salem, NC.

During their nearly 40 years of marriage, Charles and Rachel were blessed with six wonderful grandchildren! Unfortunately, Charles never knew his seventh grandchild, a grandson born to Susanne in February 1966, about 3 months after his very sudden and untimely death on December 1, 1995.



John B. Vogler John is the son of Jerry B. and Patty M. Vogler, and the younger brother of Jerry B. Vogler, Jr., all born and raised in Winston-Salem, NC and surrounding environs. As a teenager, John developed a fascination with maps and satellite images of the world and a curiosity with what he might find out beyond the horizon. After high

North Carolina State University, the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, receiving B.A. and M.A. degrees in Geography, specializing in earth sciences and geographic information systems. Various travels with friends and family (including Swiss Trips II and III) and other work-related journeys have taken John throughout the US, Canada, central America, Europe, Southeast Asia and southern China. While it may sound cliché, he truly believes that traveling is one of the best educational experiences one can have, and he is very thankful for those opportunities and memories.

John is the descendant of Samuel Vogler, the fourth child of Philipp Christoph Vogler. He was invited to become a BOD member in 1998, right on the heels of his participation in Swiss Trip II. He became the PCVF Advertising Chairman in 1999, a Lifetime PCVF member in 2003, and he has developed and maintained the Foundation's website, voglerfoundation.org, since 2003. He currently resides in Honolulu, Hawaii, having moved from Chapel Hill, NC in 2001. He is a geographer/geographic information technology specialist at the East-West Center. The position involves, not surprisingly, a good deal of digital mapping and travel to Southeast Asia. His only regret in life was not picking up the guitar at a much earlier age, but even that hasn't been so bad.


