

The newsletter will run several updated articles from the **Descendents of Philipp Christoph Vogler since its publication.** As we continue to further our research on the Vogler family, it is our desire to inspire each of you to further your own immediate family genealogy.

GERMANY: PHILIPP CHRISTOPH VOGLER'S GERMAN ANCESTORS By Dr. Frederick W. Vogler

(Revised and updated since first published in 1994 as Chapter I Part B of Descendents of Philipp Christoph Vogler

[ed. Charles M. Vogler, Camden, Maine: Penobscot Press])

THIRD INSTALLMENT:

About twenty miles east of the Rhine River and slightly less than that from the historic city of Karlsruhe, the quiet old town of Gondelsheim lies in the southwestern corner of modern Germany, in a district now attached to the modern state of Baden-Wuerttemberg but long a part of the medieval Palatinate, one of a cluster of feudal domains making up the crazy-quilt jumble of the Holy Roman Empire prior to German unification as a single nation-state in the late Nineteenth Century. Gondelsheim appears to have enjoyed remarkable stability during the last two centuries, with census figures showing a gradual increase in its population from about 1300 inhabitants to about 1700 in the post-World War II period. One noteworthy change, however, is to be seen in its church-membership statistics. Although Gondelsheim became and remained a virtually all-Protestant community during the first two centuries after the Reformation, with even its Jewish population outnumbering its tiny Roman Catholic population by a 10-to-1 ratio early in the 1800s, the demographic upheaval caused by the Allied victory in World War II has now produced a significant Roman Catholic population of several hundred inhabitants in the town. This group is largely made up of ethnic German refugees expelled by other countries from eastern districts like Silesia and the Sudetenland. As for Gondelsheim's economy, even today it remains primarily agricultural, with no major industry in its immediate vicinity. It should be noted that the original spelling of its name was "Gundelsheim" (reflecting its local pronunciation), enough of a difference to keep us from identifying it as our German ancestral home until as recently as 1980 when we finally learned that it was indeed the same place.

It was to this town (at the time still spelled "Gundelsheim") that Rudolf Vogler made his way from Switzerland a little over 300 years ago. His name appears for the first time as a town resident in the Lutheran parish register on February 5, 1695, on the occasion of his marriage as a Swiss widower to Anna Maria Strauss, German widow of Georg Bartel Keller. Fifteen months later, his first child by this new marriage was born, a daughter named Anna Barbara. But the parish register notes that her baptism had to be performed in the nearby town of Bretten and by a Calvinist minister rather than the family's own Lutheran pastor because of the occupation of Gondelsheim by French soldiers who had invaded the district during the ongoing Nine Years' War (or War of the League of Augsburg). As it happened, Louis XIV had claimed the Palatinate for France and himself as the brother-in-law of the Duchess of Orleans, herself the daughter of the German Elector Palatine, whose capital city of Heidelberg lay just a few miles to the north of Gondelsheim itself. Since Louis XIV had outlawed any form of public worship other than Roman Catholicism in France eleven years earlier by his revocation of the Edict of Nantes in 1685, his army seems not to have been disposed to permit such Protestant rites as public baptism in foreign areas under its control.

Twenty years later, in 1715, Anna Barbara was married in Gondelsheim to Johann Georg Kuehne, a man described in the parish register as a citizen of Chur in the Grisons Canton of eastern Switzerland, a union that must have pleased her own Swiss father Rudolph. As a matter of fact, that same register reveals the presence in Gondelsheim at that time of several other Swiss natives who had somehow found their way there, with fully a dozen entries mentioning them during the period from 1692 to 1719, part of a substantial number of Swiss known to have settled at that time in what is now southwestern Germany and who were called Swiss Palatines as a group. In 2003, we had the good fortune to establish contact with Andreas Bischoff of Berlin, Germany, whose wife Sabine is a direct descendant of Anna Barbara Vogler Kuehne and whose family continued to live in Gondelsheim for several generations before moving first to Heidelberg, then years later to far-off Berlin. As it happens, Andreas Bischoff has established a genealogical website (www.family.bischoff.de) of great value to us since it traces his wife's recorded Vogler ancestry in Switzerland and Germany as well as his own Bischoff ancestry, allowing us to fill in many gaps in what we had been able to learn ourselves up until four years ago.

In 1698, two years after Anna Barbara's birth, the Gondelsheim parish register reports the birth and baptism of Rudolf's and Anna Maria's first son, Hans Georg, who in turn was to become Philipp Christoph's father 25 years later. Over the next ten years, another son and three daughters were to be born to Rudolf and Anna Maria, all of whom died in early childhood. As a young man, Hans Georg married a woman named Catharina, by whom he was to have five sons and a daughter during the period from 1723 to 1732. Their first child was Philipp Christoph himself, born on April 2, 1723 and baptized soon after, according to the parish register. Philipp Christoph's mother died in 1735, three weeks before the death of her Swiss father-in-law Rudolf. In July 1736, Hans Georg married again in the nearby town of Maulbronn, this time to a woman named Anna Maria Klingslin, by whom he had one child who survived infancy, a daughter named Maria Margaretha, born in 1738.

This half-sister of Philipp Christoph was later to undertake a life of far-ranging migration that in some ways resembled his own, although hers was to take her in the opposite direction from his. Forty-two years after the departure of her father and eldest half-brother for North America, Maria Margaretha Vogler Osswald left home in 1784 with her husband and children to join a group of others from the same region of southwestern Germany in order to take advantage of the Austrian Empress Maria Theresa's offer of a new home as settlers in a border area of her empire in what is now northern Serbia just south of the present Hungarian frontier and not far from the Romanian frontier to the northeast. As in the case of those other German pioneers in North America who had founded the town of Broad Bay (now Waldoboro) on the coast of Maine and soon thereafter the Moravian congregation town of Salem (now part of Winston-Salem) in North Carolina, these settlers were assigned to organize a new town made up of ethnic Germans of similar backgrounds and traditions, in this case as part of a buffer being created between the Slavic and Germanic areas of the Austrian Empire. That town, later given the Serbian name of Crvenka, was to remain an outpost of German language and culture until the end of World War II in 1945. Among Maria Margaretha Vogler's Osswald descendants, some are known to have come at some point to the United States and settled in the area of Springfield, Ohio. At any rate, both Philipp Christoph and his half-sister, having been permanently separated early in life, were to end their days a little over two centuries ago in remarkably similar circumstances far from their Gondelsheim birthplace and even farther from each other, one in the southeastern United States, the other in the Balkans of central Europe. Known Deaths In The Family



Herbert Alexander Vogler, Jr., 83, of Winston-Salem, NC passed away on February 4, 2008. He was born January 25, 1925 to Herbert A Vogler, Sr. and Louise Henley Vogler, and was a resident in Old Salem until his marriage to Frances Miller Sowers on December 5, 1953. Mr. Vogler lived in a house across the street from the house his great, great-grandfather, John Vogler, built. 
