A copy of the Philip Christoph Vogler Deed, Dated September 10, 1770 was obtained from the County Court House at Wiscasset, ME in June 1985 during my trip to the old Philip Vogler farm in Waldoboro, ME. Because we presented the landmark sign in our Newsletter, it is appropriate to present this historical deed now. To help you, here is the typed version of it, if you find any errors in the translation, please advise (note the capital S's whenever two appear together)...Enjoy.

Fogler To Shaffer

To all People to whom these Presents shall come Philip Togler of a Place called Broad Bay in the County of Lincoln and Province of the MaSsachusetts Bay in New England yeoman & Katherine his Wife find Greeting.

Know ye that we the said Philip Togler & Katherine Togler, for and in consideration of the Sum of one hundred Pounds lawful money, to us in hand at & before the ensealing & delivery hereof, paid by John Martin Shaeffer of Broad Bay aforesaid Clerk, the Keceipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, & for divers other good Causes & Considerations us hereinto moving, have remised released Sold and forever Quitclaimed, and by these Presents for our Selves & our Heirs do romi Se release Sell & forever quitclaim unto the said John Martin Shaeffer his Heirs and Assigns all that certain Tract of Land lying in Broadbay aforesaid, being Lot Number nine on the eastern Side of Broadbay Kiver containing one hundred acres, bounded as followith, to wit, South on Land in the PoSseSsion of Christopher Newhouse, North on Land in the PoSseSsion of John Newbut and Westerly on said Kiver, and from the said Kiver to run an East Course of the CompaSs twenty five Kods wide until the said one hundred acres are made up and completed. Together with all the Estate Kight Title Interest, Use Property Claim and Demand whatsoever of us the said Philip Togler & Katherine Togler, which we now have or at any Time heretofore had, of, in, & to the aforementioned Premises with the appurtenances, or to any part thereof, or which at any Time heretofore has been held used occupied or enjoyed as part or parcel of the Same. To have and to hold all the aforegranted and bargained Premises with the appurtenances to him the said John Martin Shaeffer his Jeirs and Assigns forever, with the Kiwer Sion Kaherine Togler, nor our Heirs nor any other Person or Persons claiming from or under us or them or in the Name Kight or Stead of us or them, Shall or will by any ways or means have claim challenge or demand any Estate Kight Title or Interest of, in, & to the aforesaid Premises with the Appurtenances or any part or parcel thereof forever, but we the said Philip Togler & Katherine Togler do for ourselves our heim, Shall or will be presented. Non-Profit Status:

We are still working on obtaining nonprofit status within the guidelines of the IRS and it appears that the educational avenue is the only approach. The By-Laws have been rewritten and passed out to the Directors for review and comment.

I have contacted the company that originated the software that I am using for genealogical research and we will be able to become their dealer. This will serve two purposes; 1) help us to meet the educational requirement, and 2) provide us with income from any sale of such. It is our intent to hold seminars to demonstrate this software, take orders or to have it available for sale at the seminar, and perhaps even sell some computers too.

Membership Dues:

Our Newsletter activity has been very low because of low response in sending in dues. Perhaps we need a better understanding of dues so we will cover some of the aspects being incorporated into our bylaws:

1. We are proposing three types of

membership;

a. Regular Member - Cost \$5 per family per year. This includes both spouses and all children thru age twenty one, unless they become married, in which case a new family unit should apply for membership.

b. Life Member - Cost \$100 per family, this is a "Charter Membership Special" that we are running through June 30, 1989. Don't miss out. Support your organization so that we can have some funds for reunions. No dues thereafter for life for both spouses. See cut-out form on Page 7. We will run a list of the Life Members in every Newsletter.

c. Honorary Member - Named by the Board of Directors.

2. All dues shall be paid directly to

the Treasurer (See Form on Page 7).

3. Dues paid in the PCVM fiscal year (May 1 to April 30) are applied in that particular year, all excess will be applied to following years or as directed by the Member.

4. The rights and privileges of a Member will be terminated on April 30 of the

fiscal year following the expiration of the membership. In other words two years without paying dues. The rights and privileges of a Member are defined as holding office, voting, receiving the Newsletter, and being eligible for special passes at the reunion.

5. Any Member will be reinstated on payment of dues for the fiscal year of their application to the Philip Christoph Vogler

Memorial.

6 The resignation of a Member shall be made in writing to the Corporate Secretary and shall become effective when received or as specified therein. Prorated refund of dues paid will be made upon request.

In the future, if you paid your dues you will receive your newsletter as long as there are funds available for postage.

Financial Status:

Because we did not qualify as a non-profit organization, we had to file Income Tax Return for the fiscal years of 1986 and 1987. The following is a summary:

In order to start this organization on a sound footing, we had McGladrey, Hendrickson, and Pullen of Greensboro (Certified Public Accountants) do our tax return

for the above two years. The cost of this was \$315. This amount was paid by Charles M. Vogler because of our low funds. \$200 of the \$500 loan in 1986 was repaid last April. That leaves a balance of \$615 owed, of which I am reducing this debt by \$400 by applying for "Charter Lifetime Membership" for 1) me (Charles M. Vogler) and my wife Rachel, 2) my daughter Debra Vogler Pendleton and her husband William Pendleton, 3) my daughter Cindy Vogler Smith and her husband Steve Smith, and 4) my daughter Susanne Vogler Andrews and her husband Jonny Andrews. This will leave a balance of \$215 owed. The secretary reported at the Board Meeting on 2/12/89 that funds on hand were \$231.41 as of 1/15/89.

Hardware and Software status:

As of November I have a Hewlett Packard LaserJet Series II printer, that is producing fantastic prints. I also have added a Paradise VGA Plus 16 Graphics Board, this permits super display graphics of Windows 286, Page Maker, Word, PaintBrush and Write software packages. I have also upgraded Roots III and Page Maker to their latest versions. With all of this, I did have some hardware problems which caused some loss of work done in 1988. Ninety percent of which has been either updated or replaced. What this all means is I now have the necessary tools to begin serious work on the book. The new Roots permits unlimited generation of charts and graphs of genealogical data for the book with ease now.

Book Progress:

Work has been slow on the book this past year due to lack of time and inadequate computer equipment and software, which was solved as noted.
