Receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, & for
divers other good causes & Considerations us here-
unto moving, have revised released and forever
quitclaimed, and by these Presents for our selves &
our heirs do give sell & forever quitclaim
unto the said John Martin Shaffer his Heirs and
Assigns all that certain Tract of Land lying in
Broad Bay aforesaid, being Lot Number nine on the
eastern side of Broad Bay River containing one
hundred Acres, bounded as followeth, to wit, South
on Land in the Possession of Christopher Newhouse
North on Land in the Possession of John Newbut
and Westly on said River, and from said River to
run an East Course of the compass twenty five
Shods wide until the said one hundred Acres are
made up and completed. Together with all the Es-
tate Right Title Interest Use Property Claim and
Demand whatsoever of us the said Philip Hogler

A. That the said Philip Vogler, which we now have or at any
 time heretofore had, of, in, & to the aforementioned
 Premises with the appurtenances, or to any part
 thereof, or which at any time heretofore has been
 held and occupied or enjoyed as part or parcel of
 the same. To have and to hold all the aforegran-
 ted and bargained Premises with the appurtenan-
 ces to him the said John Martin Shaffer his
 Heirs and assigns forever, with the Reversion &
 Reversions, Remainder & Remainders thereof, or
 any part or parcel thereof forever, so that nei-
 ther we the said Philip Vogler & Katherine Vog-
 ler, nor our Heirs nor any other Person or Per-
 sons claiming from or under us or them or in
 the Name might or stead of us or them, shall or
 will by any ways or means have claim challenge
 or demand any Estate, Right, Title or Interest of,
 in, & to the aforesaid Premises with the appurtenances
 or any part or parcel thereof forever; but we the
 said Philip Vogler & Katherine Vogler do for our-
 selves our Heirs Executors & Administrators cov-
 enant to & with the said John Martin Shaffer his
 Heirs and assigns forever the said granted or conveyed
 Premises with the Profits Privileges & appurtenances
 thereto belonging to the said John Martin Shaffer
 his Heirs & assigns forever, to warrant secure & defend
 against the lawfull Claims & demands of any
 person or Persons claiming under us or our Heirs
 as aforesaid forever by their Possents. For witness
 whereof the said Philip Vogler & Katherine Vogler
 have hereunto set our hands seals this seventh Day
 of September, Anno Domini one thousand seven hun-

A copy of the Philip Christoph Vogler Deed, Dated September 10, 1770 was obtained from the County Court House at Wiscasset, ME in June 1985 during my trip to the old Philip Vogler farm in Waldoboro, ME. Because we presented the landmark sign in our Newsletter, it is appropriate to present this historical deed now. To help you, here is the typed version of it, if you find any errors in the translation, please advise (note the capital S's whenever two appear together)...Enjoy.

Fogler To Shaffer

To all People to whom these Presents shall come Philip Fogler of a Place called Broad Bay in the County of Lincoln and Province of the Massachusetts Bay in New England yeoman & Katherine his Wife find Greeting.

Know ye that we the said Philip Fogler & Katherine Fogler, for and in consideration of the Sum of one hundred Pounds lawful money, to us in hand at & before the enseatig & delivery hereof, paid by John Martin Shaeffer of Broad Bay aforesaid Clerk, the Receipt whereof we do hereby acknowledge, & for divers other good Causes & Considerations us hereinto moving, have remised released Sold and forever Quitclaimed, and by these Presents for our Selves & our Heirs do remiSe release Sell & forever quitclaim unto the said John Martin Shaeffer his Heirs and ASsigns all that certain Tract of Land lying in Broadbay aforesaid, being Lot Number nine on the eastern Side of Broadbay River containing one hundred acres, bounded as followith, to wit, South on Land in the PoSseSsion of Christopher Newhouse, North on Land in the PoSseSsion of John Newbut and Westerly on said River, and from the said River to run an East Course of the CompaSs twenty five Rods wide until the said one hundred acres are made up and completed. Together with all the Estate Right Title Interest, Use Property Claim and Demand whatsoever of us the said Philip Fogler & Katherine Fogler, which we now have or at any Time heretofore had, of, in, & to the aforementioned Premises with the appurtenances, or to any part thereof, or which at any Time heretofore has been held used occupiad or enjoyed as part or parcel of the Same. To have and to hold all the aforegranted and bargained Premises with the appurtenances to him the said John Martin Shaeffer his Heirs and ASsigns forever, with the RiverSion & RiverSions, Remainder & Remainders thereof, or any part or parcel thereof forever, so that neither we the said Philip Fogler & Katherine Fogler, nor our Heirs nor any other Person or Persons claiming from or under us or them or in the Name Right or Stead of us or them, Shall or will by any ways or means have claim challenge or demand any Estate Right Title or Interest of, in, & to the aforesaid Premises with the Appurtenances or any part or parcel thereof forever; but we the said Philip Fogler & Katherine Fogler do for ourselves our Heirs Executors & Administrators covenant to & with the said John Martin Shaeffer his Heirs and ASsigns the said granted & released Premises with the Profit, Privileges & appurtenances thereto belonging to the said John Martin Shaeffer his Heirs & ASsigns forever, to warrant Secure & defend against the lawful Claims & Demands of any person or persons claiming under us or our heirs as aforesaid forever by these Presents. In witness whereof the said Philip Fogler & Katherine Fogler have hereunto set our hands, & seals this Seventh Day of September, Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and Seventy, and in the tenth year of his Majesty's Reign. Philip (P his mark) Fogler & a Seal Katherine (X her mark) Fogler and a Seal. Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of Martin Ryep, David Fales.

Non-Profit Status:

We are still working on obtaining non-profit status within the guidelines of the IRS and it appears that the educational avenue is the only approach. The By-Laws have been rewritten and passed out to the Directors for review and comment.

I have contacted the company that originated the software that I am using for genealogical research and we will be able to become their dealer. This will serve two purposes; 1) help us to meet the educational requirement, and 2) provide us with income from any sale of such. It is our intent to hold seminars to demonstrate this software, take orders or to have it available for sale at the seminar, and perhaps even sell some computers too.

Membership Dues:

Our Newsletter activity has been very low because of low response in sending in dues. Perhaps we need a better understanding of dues so we will cover some of the aspects being incorporated into our bylaws:

1. We are proposing three types of membership;

a. Regular Member - Cost \$5 per family per year. This includes both spouses and all children thru age twenty one, unless they become married, in which case a new family unit should apply for membership.

b. Life Member - Cost \$100 per family, this is a "Charter Membership Special" that we are running through June 30, 1989. Don't miss out. Support your organization so that we can have some funds for reunions. No dues thereafter for life for both spouses. See cut-out form on Page 7. We will run a list of the Life Members in every Newsletter.

c. Honorary Member - Named by the Board of Directors.

2. All dues shall be paid directly to the Treasurer (See Form on Page 7).

3. Dues paid in the PCVM fiscal year (May 1 to April 30) are applied in that particular year, all excess will be applied to following years or as directed by the Member.

4. The rights and privileges of a Member will be terminated on April 30 of the

fiscal year following the expiration of the membership. In other words two years without paying dues. The rights and privileges of a Member are defined as holding office, voting, receiving the Newsletter, and being eligible for special passes at the reunion.

5. Any Member will be reinstated on payment of dues for the fiscal year of their application to the Philip Christoph Vogler Memorial.

6 The resignation of a Member shall be made in writing to the Corporate Secretary and shall become effective when received or as specified therein. Prorated refund of dues paid will be made upon request.

In the future, if you paid your dues you will receive your newsletter as long as there are funds available for postage.

Financial Status:

Because we did not qualify as a non-profit organization, we had to file Income Tax Return for the fiscal years of 1986 and 1987. The following is a summary:

In order to start this organization on a sound footing, we had McGladrey, Hendrickson, and Pullen of Greensboro (Certified Public Accountants) do our tax return

for the above two years. The cost of this was \$315. This amount was paid by Charles M. Vogler because of our low funds. \$200 of the \$500 loan in 1986 was repaid last April. That leaves a balance of \$615 owed, of which I am reducing this debt by \$400 by applying for "Charter Lifetime Membership" for 1) me (Charles M. Vogler) and my wife Rachel, 2) my daughter Debra Vogler Pendleton and her husband William Pendleton, 3) my daughter Cindy Vogler Smith and her husband Steve Smith, and 4) my daughter Susanne Vogler Andrews and her husband Jonny Andrews. This will leave a balance of \$215 owed. The secretary reported at the Board Meeting on 2/12/89 that funds on hand were \$231.41 as of 1/15/89.

Congratulations to all of our new Board Members, we hope to see you at all called meetings and hope you will lend us your talents in the coming years.

Hardware and Software status:

As of November I have a Hewlett Packard LaserJet Series II printer, that is producing fantastic prints. I also have added a Paradise VGA Plus 16 Graphics Board, this permits super display graphics of Windows 286, Page Maker, Word, PaintBrush and Write software packages. I have also upgraded Roots III and Page Maker to their latest versions. With all of this, I did have some hardware problems which caused some loss of work done in 1988. Ninety percent of which has been either updated or replaced. What this all means is I now have the necessary tools to begin serious work on the book. The new Roots permits unlimited generation of charts and graphs of genealogical data for the book with ease now.

Book Progress:

Work has been slow on the book this past year due to lack of time and inadequate computer equipment and software, which was solved as noted. However, the arrival of two grandchildren (one being the first boy in this family) just had to take priority. Yet, progress is being made by your Documentation Committee. See Book interest.

Reunion Schedule:

It is located on 230 acres, has golf, tennis, racket ball, and is facing the beautiful Penobscot Bay in Rockland, ME.

As a special treat Ben Fogler thinks we can rent a boat that will hold about 100 people and we will enter Medomak Bay up to the old Hans Georg and Philip Christoph Vogler farm (Lot No. 10) reenacting their arrival of 1742. This will be a rare and fun time experience that you don't want to miss.

The dinner would be on Saturday night as before with a Hospitality Room open on Friday night, August 24. So plan on spending Friday and Saturday nights and start home on Sunday.

Book Interest:

We are asking you to give us a show of interest on Publication of the Book on Philip Christoph Vogler and his descendants. In order to get Gateway Press to do our publication which includes guidance through the entire production procedure, they require a third of the cost when the contract is signed, a third when we get the first proof and the balance when we get the books. The quote for 1,000 copies is \$9,727 an increase of \$2,117 since the September '87 quote. However, considering cost of preparation of the manuscript, the cost per copy to Members still should not exceed \$20.
